Bags were purchased as additional storage.</li> <li>2 whiteboards were purchased, one for the hall and the other for outside PE sessions. These are so that the lesson objectives, success criteria and next steps in learning can be shared effectively with the children.</li> <li>2 sets of goal posts (2 sizes) for children to use at lunch time.</li> </ul>
