Can you see patterns in these changes? What causes the changes?</p> <p><b>Cause and consequence</b> – What are the causes of the event? Are they long term causes or short term causes?</p> <p><b>Empathy</b> – To understand the feelings of other people.</p>	<p><b>Inference</b> – what does the source/text tell you?</p> <p><b>Provenance</b> – It means where the source is from, who made it and when they made it.</p> <p><b>Purpose</b> – Why has this source been produced?</p> <p><b>Tone</b> – Is the source emotional? Is it biased? It is factual?</p> <p><b>Contextual knowledge</b> – This means the knowledge you already have.
