Our pupils are immersed in the context and learning is purposeful and meaningful, with deliberate links made to our diverse and exciting community.

Early Years Foundation Stage

Implementation Of Our Curriculum

Phonics and Reading



At JEA we use Read, Write Inc. to start on the path to reading, by recognising, blending and segmenting sounds. Comprehension lessons then follow, either by studying a whole text, or short extracts. Reading corners in classrooms provide further opportunities to read for pleasure. Reading is an integral element in every subject of our curriculum.

Writing AUTHOR

Reading and exploring the craft of great authors is at the heart of all JEA writing units. Children are immersed in text and respond through talk, drama, role play and illustrations. Oral rehearsal is encouraged whilst planning, drafting editing and finally publishing their own work. Our children read great authors to become great authors.

Maths



At JEA we aim to make maths an enjoyable and engaging learning experience, whilst developing a solid understanding and fluency of mathematical concepts. Through White Rose, Third Space and real life experiences, our children develop skills to become independent, confident and competent with maths.

Science



Science at JEA nurtures a deep understanding of the world. We aim for our children to acquire specific skills and knowledge in order to think scientifically and to question the uses and implications of science in their present and future lives.

History



At JEA we aim to instil a love and curiosity of history in all our children. We provide a relevant curriculum of local, British and worldwide history. Children recognise when a new period of history occurs and how the past affects us today.

Geography



Geography provokes and provides answers to questions about the natural and human aspects of the world. At JEA, children are encouraged to develop a greater understanding and knowledge of the world, as well as their place in it.
