Decorating eggs

Only if you have some spare eggs in the house... Take a couple of eggs and with the help of an adult place a piece of tape over both ends of the eggs and then prick the egg carefully with a pin and blow out the content... you can also use a straightened paperclip and place it in the hole and move it around to break up the yolk before blowing, once you have your empty egg carefully rinse the eggs with dish soap.

Now you can decorate as you wish ...

You can paint them, I have included a recipe on how to make your own paints if you don't have any at home, you can glue fabric, feathers or ribbons on the eggs to decorate them, you can use a marker to draw a face on your egg... be as creative as you like.

Non baking paint recipe

2 cups of white flour

2 cups of cold water

Food coloring or tempera color

Pour the water into a large bowl; add the flour slowly stirring constantly. stir until it is totally smooth, divide into smaller bowls, plastic cups or a muffin pan and add food coloring or tempera colors to each. If you have newspaper cover the surface with it before starting as it will make the cleaning up process easier.



Pin the tail on the bunny



Draw a picture of a bunny, as big as you can make it, and place it on the wall you can use blue tack or sticky tape, remember to do this with an adult. You will need cotton wool and a blind fold... if you don't have a blind fold you can use a scarf or clean tea towel. If you don't have any cotton wool you can draw and cut out a tail using paper instead... remember to stick something on the back of the tail (blue tack or sticky tape) so it sticks to the bunny. The person who sticks the tail closest to the right place on the bunny wins. Have fun!

Making a Pancake

Perfect pancake recipe!

Fancy joining in the fab pancake fun? Then get whisking and flipping with this six-step pancake recipe.

What you'll need:



100g plain flour 2 eggs 300ml semi-skimmed milk Pinch of salt 1tbsp sunflower/vegetable oil Butter for frying Bowl Whisk/fork Frying pan Ladle Fish slice Yummy toppings - such as lemon, chocolate spread, marshmallows, fruit, or whatever you fancy!

 Take a bowl and pour in the milk and oil, then break in the eggs. Now take the whisk and beat the ingredients together to make a frothy mixture.

2) Once that's done, take another bowl and mix together the flour and a pinch of salt with your hands. Messy!

3) Now slowly pour the liquid into the middle of the flour mixture, whisking all the time, until the batter you're making is quite runny. If it's a little lumpy, keep whisking away until your pancake mix is nice and smooth!

4) With an adult's help, warm the frying pan to a medium heat, then add a little butter. Once it's melted, ladle in enough pancake mix to cover the bottom of the pan, then tilt it in a circular motion so the mix spreads evenly. Now you're cooking!

5) Now for the fun bit! When your pancake starts to brown underneath, hold the pan handle in one hand, slide the spatula under the pancake and flip it over. Next, ask an adult to help you flip it the fancy way!

6) Repeat steps one to four for each pancake and stack them high! Traditional toppings are lemon juice and sugar. But you can also try chocolate spread, peanut butter, fruit, honey, whipped cream or a healthy dollop of yogurt. Tuck in and enjoy!
