





An old tradition at Easter was to decorate hard-boiled eggs and roll them down a hill. The winner was the person whose egg reached the bottom first. Unfortunately, we can't roam freely at the moment, but we can still use eggs in a fun activity. For this activity, you could use hard-boiled eggs, chocolate eggs or even an egg-shaped pebble.



Egg zip wire

Can you build a harness or a basket to transport an egg down a zip wire? This is a great activity for learning about friction.


Friction is a force that slows down moving objects. Friction can also prevent objects starting to move. Smooth surfaces have less friction than rough surfaces.

Try changing the type of material used for the zip wire: it doesn't have to be wire - you could use string or knitting wool.

Due to the current circumstances, I understand that you will not be able to use eggs for this next activity. Instead you can make 3D eggs from cardboard or paper that you have lying around. ©

1-Take an egg (or more) if you can get hold of any and boil it. Or you can make a 3D egg out of cardboard or paper. With a black marker draw some jagged lines like this



2- Using some yellow paint or marker draw an oval shape, this will be the body of the little chick.



3-Using black paint or black marker, fill in the area around the yellow oval within the jagged lines, like this:



4-Finally, draw the eyes and eyebrows with the black marker / black paint and the beak with red paint or marker.




How to make a chatterbox!


Instructions



Take a square of paper.




Unfold it and your paper should look like this.




Fold the corners to the center again.



Flip your paper over and add a color or a different object you can spell to each section.



Fold it over like this.




Fold all 4 corners to the center of the square so the points just touch




Your paper should look like this.



Fold it sideways like Figure 1 then unfold it. Now fold it up like Figure 2.




Unfold it.



Now fold it the other way.




Your paper should look like this.



Flip your paper over so the folds you just made are turned down.



Write the numbers 1-8 as shown above. Two on each flap.




fortunes by lifting each flap and writing a fortune under each number.



Put your fingers under the 4 open corners.



Here is how it looks finished and open.




How to Make a Flextangle

Note: For best results use thin card. Colour in each triangle of the flextangle. Make sure each triangle in a row is coloured in using the same colours. Each row can be different to one another, to make different patterns. All of the triangles in row A should look the same, all of the triangles in row B should look the same, and so on. You can also find a demonstration video here.



After colouring the flextangle, cut the whole flextangle out around the edge.



Fold the dashed vertical lines towards you (a "valley" fold). Crease them well, then unfold to make the flextangle flat again.



Next, fold all of the diagonal lines away from you (a "mountain" fold) and crease them well. Make sure you fold both diagonals! Unfold the flextangle again.



Add glue to the tabs marked 'glue' and press the tube together to help it stick.



Carefully wrap the flextangle into a tube-like shape, matching dot to dot.




Add glue to the end tab and tuck it into the open end of the tube. Press the ends together to make sure it sticks well.



Let your glue dry and then have a go at playing with your flextangle. Can you see all of your different patterns?
