Activity 1 Europe topic You have researched an European country of your choice. Now imagine you are going to visit the capital city in your chosen country. Make a leaflet to help you with your visit.		
What information do you need to find out before you go there? Here are some questions you can ask:		
What is the size of the city? (Could be how much land or how many people.)		
What currency is used there?		
What language is spoken in the city?		
What landmarks are there in the city? (Pictures?)		
What can you do in the city?		
What traditional foods are eaten there? Write a food review of a typical dish.		
What rivers run through the city?		
Is there a transport system? How can you get there from London?		
Activity 2 Art. Imagine you have visited your capital city but you could not take any photos. Create a piece of art based on a well known view or famous landmark or building in the city. It could be a detailed drawing, a painting or a model or even a collage. You can choose the media (paint, pencils, pastels, crayons) or even use more than one.		

Make sure it is your best work and completed to a high standard. You might frame it. It will need a title.

EXT: write a description to go with it when it is exhibited. How to find it/ what it is for (if it is a building)/who designed it /why it was built. Perhaps you can think of some "Did you knows" or famous facts to quiz people with.
