To be a historian, you have to act as a detective.

Search for clues about the past and put them together to find out what happened.

Whom can you ask about the past?

Older people in your family can tell you a lot about what life was like in the past.

A good way to find out what someone remembers is to interview them. You can do this by ringing a family member, skype or face time.

What can they tell you about the past? Record your interview or take notes. Remember to use open questions e.g. How has slough changed for you over the years? Research the internet about Slough, your street or James Elliman Academy.
